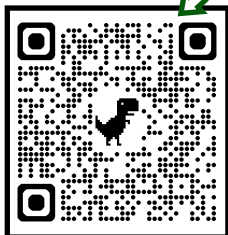

WHAT CAN YOU EXPECT FROM SERVING AT NESS LAKE BIBLE CAMP?

MINISTRY EXPERIENCE

- **Program Team** (Cabin Leaders, Junior Cabin Leaders, Summer Team Coordinators, LIT Coordinators, Lifeguards, Program Coordinators, Day Camp Leaders, AV Techs, Worship Coordinator, and A Team): The Program Team is involved in small and large group leadership opportunities on a daily basis throughout the summer. The focus of your efforts will be spiritual, recreational, and social. Camp is a great place to put your knowledge to work, and to become an effective servant in the Kingdom of God. Are you ready to be on the front lines? Do you want an opportunity to share the Gospel with children and teenagers? Join the Program Team!
- **Support Team** (Kitchen, Maintenance, Office, Store): Jesus came "as one that serves". The Support Team works behind the scenes creating the platform required to give kids a great week at camp. It is a vital part of NLBC's ministry. NLBC's Support Team allows you to use and develop your gifts and bring glory to God by learning to serve Him with joy.

SPIRITUAL GROWTH – You will be challenged and stretched as you build relationships and share Christ with campers through daily activities, Bible studies, and Chapel times. You will be asked to go beyond your normal limits, and as you do so you will be able to see God work in and through you. You may even have the opportunity to lead a child to Christ! We also recognize that those serving need to be built into and discipled as well. Every member of our Summer Team is a part of a small group which will meet twice weekly to pray, read, and hold each other accountable. There is also a weekly worship night where we spend time worshipping God together. Whatever the summer brings, it will provide ample opportunity for you to grow in trust with God.

PERSONAL GROWTH – We believe your volunteer experience is just as important as the experience we offer campers. Times together at Summer Team Training and Summer Team Camp are an important way of building community. The NLBC Board and Year Round Missionaries work hard to maintain an environment that fosters deep friendships, love and respect, and lots of fun and laughter. It is our hope that the friendships and memories made at camp will last a lifetime! Just ask someone who was involved last summer, and they'll say, "It's one of the most significant things I've ever done!"

SKILL DEVELOPMENT – Ness Lake Bible Camp places an emphasis on skill development. Campers may choose to participate in archery, canoeing, crafts, nature study, outdoor living, riflery, rock climbing, water skiing, or wakeboarding. Applicants with training and skills in one or more area are given preference. Regardless, you will have the opportunity to learn and participate in a wide range of activities. Summer Team Training will also include specific training in activities and basic First Aid for some positions.

SPRING CREW POSITIONS

Busy during July & August but available for end of April, May and June? Or available end of April all through to August? Spring Crew is a great fit for any schedule. Spring provides a remarkable opportunity for Spring Crew to showcase camp to many potential campers! Energy will also be focused on setting up and improving our main site and our satellite camp, WilderNess. Room and board is provided plus an expected honorarium of \$2300 is available if you work the full spring session from **April 27 - June 23**. **Fundraising is now a part of Spring Crew which means you can make up to a total of \$6,068 with funds raised.** Please note those who are able to raise funds above the personal fundraising goal will still receive all that they fundraise, which when combined with the NLBC honorariums, will meet, but not exceed, the designated positional maximum for your position. If you are not able to join us from **April 27 - June 23**, please indicate your availability on your application.

◆ Spring Crew Coordinator (1)

The Spring Crew Coordinator starts 1 week early (**April 20th**) and oversees the Spring Crew in their day-to-day tasks. Responsibilities include, but are not limited to: being a liaison with guest groups, scheduling Spring Crew to cover guest group and camp's needs, coordinating Spring Crew social events, leading daily meetings and general supervision. Spring Crew Coordinator reports to the Guest Services Manager and Operations Director.

◆ Spring Crew (15-20)

Spring Crew serve rental groups and assist with the preparation of the property for our summer programs. They will work under the supervision of the Spring Crew Coordinator. If you are interested, please indicate Spring Crew on your application and more information will be provided. Number of positions pending guest group schedule. Reports to the Spring

SPRING CREW RETURNING BONUS:

SUMMER TEAM POSITIONS

Life has continued to become more expensive, so we have raised honorarium amounts through our budget (fundraising, camper fees, guest group fees, donations) to be a blessing for all of you who dedicate your summer to serving at NLBC. Honorariums are given by days volunteered (**full**

summer is 48.5 days) which works out to be:

Support Team Positions - \$2800/Full Summer

Leading Team Positions - \$2400/Full Summer

Junior Team Positions - \$1600/Full Summer

We are also going to assist you in fundraising for your positions through support letters. Our goal is for Summer Team members to go above and beyond the NLBC honorarium amounts (above) through personal fundraising. This could more than double your total earnings for the summer.

NLBC Honorariums + personal fundraising = designated positional maximum as follows:

Support Team Positions - \$8000/Full Summer

Leading Team Positions - \$7400/Full Summer

Junior Team Positions - \$7200/Full Summer

The goal is that, with prayer, you will be able to see the Lord provide for you in new and amazing ways. We would love to see your personal fundraising go above your honorarium, therefore getting you your designated positional maximum. In accordance with the One Hope Canada Missionary model, the overall funds that you receive cannot exceed your designated positional maximum. Those who are able to raise funds above the personal fundraising goal will still receive all that they fundraise, which, when combined with the NLBC honorariums, will meet, but not exceed, the designated positional maximum for your position.

***Returning summer team members can receive a returning bonus up to 750\$ on top of these amounts! Check out the bonus details on page 12!**



LEADING TEAM POSITIONS

◆ **Cabin Leader (11M) (11F)**

Cabin Leaders are responsible for leading a cabin of 10 campers each week, with the assistance of a Jr Cabin Leader. Cabin Leaders are also expected to instruct/assist in activities, and to assist with the program as directed. Duties may include 1 to 2 weeks at WilderNess on Little Ness Lake. Must be at least 18 years of age. CLs report to the Summer Team Coordinators.

◆ **Day Camp Leader (1)**

The Day Camp Leader will be responsible for cabin leading and directing up to 36 day campers with the help of a Cabin Leader and two Jr Cabin Leaders. Duties also include check in and out everyday at the drop off location, and supervising campers on the bus. The Day Camp Leader is expected to instruct/assist in activities, and to assist with the program as directed. Must be at least 18 years of age. Preference will be given to applicants who have served on Summer Team previously. Reports to Program Director, Dayna Penson.

◆ **Lifeguard (2)**

Lifeguards assist the Waterfront Coordinator at NLBC. Lifeguards must be 16 on or before May 1, 2026, and must have current NLS and Standard First Aid certification valid to **September 1, 2026. Copy of certification required.**

◆ **Office Assistant (1)**

The Office Assistant answers the phone, takes messages, edits and emails support letters, and assists and reports to the Office Manager, Stephanie Swan

◆ **Store/T-Shirts Coordinator (1)**

Running the camp store (Trading Post) including: sales, inventory control, tuck and producing camper t-shirts weekly. There is great potential for ministry to other volunteers with this position. Reports to the Guest Services Manager, Johanna Groenberg.

◆ **Maintenance Assistant (2)**

(Support Team depending on skill/age) Help with ongoing maintenance needs at camp. The Maintenance Assistants report to the Facilities Manager, Joseph Klassen.

◆ **Groundskeeper (1)**

(Support Team depending on skill/age) The Groundskeeper takes care of lawns, landscaping, flower beds, and other outdoor areas of camp. They keep the grounds tidy and beautiful under the supervision of the Facilities Manager. Is also expected to help the Maintenance Team when needed. Experience with landscaping and basic tools is preferred.

◆ **Program Leader (1)**

The Program Leader works under the direction of the Program Director. They lead the Junior Program Leaders and their daily scheduling; they also assist the Program Coordinator in the setting up/facilitating of games and other activities. This position delegates, assists with, and communicates with other departments about jobs around camp.

SUPPORT TEAM POSITIONS

◆ **Summer Team Coordinator (4)**

STCs work as a team to provide ongoing supervision, training, and encouragement for the Cabin Leaders. Duties include: cabin leader assignments, facilitating daily and weekly Bible studies, discipline, working with higher need campers and can include some interaction with parents. Preferably 21 years or older and have attended a post secondary institution. Works under the Recruitment and Discipleship Manager, Stephen Bonnett.

◆ **Program Coordinator (2)**

The Program Coordinators work in conjunction with and under the direction of the Program Director. One Program Coordinator will manage the A-team and personnel scheduling while the other Program Coordinator focuses on the preparation and running of games and activities. NLBC will pay for the applicants to obtain their Pleasure Craft Operators Card.

◆ **Audio Visual Tech (1)**

The AV Tech will be responsible for taking digital pictures and video footage at NLBC and WilderNess and to create weekly videos for campers with the assistance of the AV Tech Assistant. Experience with video editing software and digital photography is essential. Send us a sample of your work! Reports to the Program Director.

◆ **Kitchen Team Lead (2)**

To assist the Food Services Manager, in all areas of food preparation and supervision of kitchen staff. Previous cooking experience is required. FoodSafe training may be provided, however preference may be given to those who already have it. This experience will benefit you greatly! You'll learn and use many skills that will help you in future endeavors.

◆ **Program Specialist (3)**

The Program Specialists are responsible for organizing the water ski/wakeboarding and rock climbing programs. NLBC will pay for the applicants to obtain their Pleasure Craft Operators Card. Completion of the Pleasure Craft Operators License prior to camp start is required. Program Specialists must have 5 years driving experience and be at least 21 years old.

◆ **Waterfront Coordinator (1)**

The Waterfront Coordinator is responsible for providing a safe and fun program in and on the water at NLBC. This position reports to the Operations Director and must be 19+ years old on or before May 1, 2026. **It is preferred to have NLS certification valid to September 1, 2026. Copy of certification required.**

◆ **Head LIT Coordinator (1)**

The Head LIT Coordinator will work closely with the Recruitment and Discipleship Manager to organize the LIT program. The LIT program operates as a 'camp within a camp'. Each session will have up to 20 participants. If you have a heart for discipleship and you love hard work, this could be the best job you ever have!

◆ **LIT Coordinator (3)**

LIT Coordinators work under the direction of the Head LIT Coordinator to provide an exceptional work and discipleship program for teenage participants. LIT Coordinators function as 'Cabin Leaders' to LITs. This is a demanding but rewarding job.

◆ **Worship Coordinator (1)**

The Worship Coordinator organizes the worship and music teams. Duties include communicating with weekly guest speakers and assisting with program as required. This position will be paired with another non-cabin leading position as fits best.

◆ **Social Media (1)**

Will help post information and pictures to social media. This position will be paired with another non-cabin leading position as fits best.

JUNIOR TEAM POSITIONS

◆ **Junior Cabin Leaders (12M) (13F)**

Jr Cabin Leaders work directly with campers under the supervision of Summer Team Coordinators and a Cabin Leader. They are also involved in activities instruction, cabin discussion, and all aspects of camp life. Duties may include 1 to 2 weeks in the WilderNess Program. Ages 16 and up. *Preference will be given to graduates of the LIT program at NLBC.*

◆ **Kitchen Assistant (8)**

Kitchen Assistants help with food preparation and service. Must be able to follow directions, work quickly and accurately, and have good physical stamina. Previous experience is an asset but not required.

◆ **Assistant Lifeguard (2)**

Assistant Lifeguards assist the Waterfront Coordinator at NLBC. This person must be 16+ on or before May 1, 2026, and have current Bronze Cross or NLS certification valid to **September 1, 2026. A copy of certification is required.**

◆ **Junior Program Leaders (3)**

The Junior Program Leaders will be working with the Program Leader in completing tasks, setup, and helping out with Skills. When not needed by Program they may be assigned to other odd jobs around camp, including WilderNess. They are a vital part of supporting the Cabin Leading Team by doing a WIDE variety of tasks as they arise.

◆ **Audio Visual Tech Assistant (1)**

(Leading Team depending on skill/age) The Audio Visual Tech crew will be responsible for taking digital pictures and video footage at NLBC and WilderNess and for creating weekly videos for campers. Experience with video editing software and digital photography is essential. Send us a sample of your work!

WilderNess Positions

WilderNess has lots of great options to make your summer one to remember! If you're looking for something different, why not try a summer at WilderNess!

EXPEDITION CAMPS!!! New WilderNess Expedition camp uses day trips to explore unique locations around the Prince George area. With a bus-by-day and bush-by-night experience, campers will look to take the adventure head on.

WilderNess is located on Little Ness Lake, 3 km from our main camp. Our beautiful 10 acre site offers a 'back-to-the-basics' camping experience where you can rough-it in style.

WilderNess features huge canvas wall tents with plywood floors, amazing meals cooked outdoors, swimming, hiking, kayaking, archery, outdoor chapels around a campfire, and much more! Get to know everyone in camp! Registration is limited to 40 campers per session. *Some Summer team members may be assigned to WilderNess for a part of their summer.*

◆ WilderNess Assistant Director (2)

(Support Team) Will work together to assist the WilderNess Director, with their duties: implementing the satellite program on Little Ness Lake for up to 40 campers per session, and assisting in training, directing, and encouraging the WilderNess Team. Love for the outdoors is a must.

◆ WilderNess Lifeguard (1)

(Leading Team) The WilderNess Lifeguard is responsible for providing a safe and fun program in and on the water at WilderNess. This position reports to the Waterfront Director, must be 19+ on or before May 1, 2026, and must have NLS certification valid to **September 1, 2026**. WilderNess Lifeguard may double as a Cabin Leader. **A copy of NLS certification is required.**

◆ WilderNess Head Cook (1)

(Support Team) Responsible for menu planning, purchasing, inventory control, and food preparation for up to 55 people per session for 6 summer sessions as well as spring guest groups. Volunteers and campers will also be involved in meal preparation and cleanup. Must love the outdoors. FoodSafe training will be provided if needed.

◆ WilderNess Cook (1)

(Junior or Leading Team depending on skill/age) Will assist WilderNess Head Cook with their duties. Volunteers and campers will also be involved in meal preparation



2026 DAY CAMPS

After doing day camps in 2021, we realized there was an opportunity to provide kids more ways to come to camp by offering both day and overnight camps. Day campers will be bussed to camp from a location in town every morning, and bussed back to town for pick-up before supper. The Day Camp Leader with the help of three Cabin Leaders, will be in charge of these campers and will be riding on the bus with campers. The day campers will have a similar schedule as the overnight campers during the time they are at camp. This makes it easier for kids who don't want to stay overnight to still come and have a great camp experience!

WHAT IS THE LIT PROGRAM?

For Teens Going into Grades 10-12

The LIT program is led by some of our most knowledgeable and wisest summer team members in order to ensure a high quality experience.

This is a 3-4 week diverse and highly rewarding program, designed to combine the fun of camp with valuable training to prepare participants to be our future star summer team members. LITs will develop many skills and work in many areas, including: kitchen, dishes, cleaning bathrooms, maintenance and program. The LITs will go through many of our summer team training seminars, as well as multiple devotionals to help build both their faith and knowledge. Former LITs will be given preferred consideration for summer team.

LIT's get breaks/weekends on the same schedule as our weekly camps. Reference the camper schedule to see when the LIT will be required to be at camp or on a break.

LIT registration is subject to an application.

WORK CREW TO LIT PROGRAM CHANGES

When Work Crew was created in 2001, it was a unique opportunity for teens to come to camp for 3 weeks and wash dishes, do Bible studies, clean bathrooms, be mentored, take part in the camp community and work outside on various projects. Gradually we added more opportunities to learn from Cabin Leaders about cabin leading and other leadership training. To reflect this change, we changed the name in 2022 to Leader-in-Training! We're very excited for this change. It also means that the names for Cabin Leaders/LITs have changed to Cabin Leader and Junior Cabin Leader.

All Main Camp camps have Day Camp options

Purpose:

To encourage people to be involved in summer ministry, and to provide an opportunity for them to discover how faithful God can be in providing for their needs both in prayer and finances.

Qualifications:

You must be an accepted member of the 2026 Summer Team.

Procedure:

- All summer team members are required to actively participate in seeking prayer partners.
- After your selection as a member of the 2026 Summer Team, you will be required to submit a list of 20 names (and email addresses) of people that will form your prayer support team. Include family, friends and church members in your support network. Choose this group carefully and prayerfully. You may want to ask for guidance from your parents, pastor, etc. Often, churches will partner with summer missionaries through prayer and finances. Every summer team member should discuss this with his or her home church. Please bring your list of names to Summer Team Training (or better yet, submit it through the applicable link a couple of weeks before Summer Team Training begins!).
- You will be required (and given time) to write a support letter to those on your list so that they can be praying for you throughout the summer and they are given the option to make a donation for your work. NLBC will assist with direction as you write your letter, if required.
- Donors who wish to give financial support can designate their support to a specific position serving at NLBC (i.e. Cabin leader #x, "your name").
- We will send Thank You cards to financial supporters before Christmas.
- All gifts for support must be payable to Ness Lake Bible Camp. Receipts for income tax purposes will be issued for all gifts of \$20+.



NLBC FINANCIAL POLICY

NLBC is a faith mission. We rely on the provision of God through the gifts of His people to supplement camper fees to meet our expenses. God is faithful and has always provided for the needs of camp since its inception in 1953. We know this will challenge you, however we believe that God will meet your needs and that you will grow in your faith as you trust Him. Summer Volunteers at NLBC rely on God as they serve Him (Ps. 34:8; Mal. 3:10; Prov. 3:5, 6). NLBC endeavors to be as generous as possible with our team. We strive to support you in 4 ways:

- **HONORARIUMS** - All accepted summer missionaries receive honorariums.
- **ROOM & BOARD** - NLBC provides all meals and accommodation during camp sessions in the summer at no cost to our team.
- **TRAVEL EXPENSES** - NLBC will reimburse travel costs up to \$250 for Summer Team (excluding PG residents and varies depending on distance travelled; receipts required).
- **PRAYER & FUNDRAISING SUPPORT** - We will help with your support letter & will pray with and for you.

“BUT I NEED A REAL JOB”

If you're weighing the options of getting a traditional job for the summer or working at camp, consider this! There are many benefits to working at camp, both in new skills and strengths, as well as in your spiritual life. Studies have shown that **“youth who attended religious summer camp were significantly more likely to be involved in religious small groups, attend church, and remain affiliated with their religious tradition 5 years later than those youth who did not attend”** (The Summer Camp Experience and Faith Formation of Emerging Adults, Sorenson, 2014). Many Bible colleges also offer tuition reductions and donation matching if you work at a Bible camp over the summer.

Make sure to find out what your post secondary offers and how to access it! Skills and benefits you could receive from working at camp (varies by position) include:

- How to teach activities
- Safety instruction and direction
- Conflict resolution
- Self-motivation
- Practical leadership
- Problem solving
- Public speaking
- Communication
- Collaboration
- Teamwork
- Independence
- Boating license
- FoodSafe certification
- First Aid training
- Lifeguarding courses
- Volunteer hours that are required for high school programs and some post secondary
- Excellent letters of recommendation and references for grants, scholarships, job applications and education programs. Many doctors, nurses and educators have been accepted into their programs because of their experience and letters provided by camp.

A SAMPLE BUDGET BREAKDOWN

We know that you make a sacrifice to be at camp over the summer instead of getting a job somewhere else. We'd like to make that easier for you. Below we made a guess at where you might be saving/losing by coming out to camp based on money.

Estimated full-time minimum wage income:

\$17.85 x 8hrs/day x 48.5 days of the summer = \$6,925

Average Expenses for 8.5 weeks:

Fuel/Insurance: \$350-\$550

Groceries: \$450-\$650

Restaurants: \$150-\$300

Phone: \$100-\$200

Entertainment: Movies, bowling, mall, mini golf, drive-in, etc.: \$400-\$600

Rent: \$600-\$1,600

Total: \$2,050-\$3,900

Average income: \$6,925

Average cost of living: - \$2,975

= **\$3,950**

Honorarium as a cabin leader (varies from year to year, and by position):

A full summer honorarium (48.5 days) = **\$2400**

Average Expenses for 8.5 weeks at camp:

Fuel/Insurance: \$255-\$455

Groceries: \$0-\$100

4. In the person of the Holy Spirit, whose ministry is to glorify the Lord Jesus Christ, draw all people to Him, renew the believing sinner, and indwell, guide, instruct and empower the believer for godly living and service.
5. In the existence of Satan, a created being and an enemy of God.
6. All people, though created in the image of God, have rebelled and are totally sinful, unable to please God; all will one day be resurrected and only by being born again through faith in the Lord Jesus Christ alone can they receive salvation and the gift of eternal life, thus escaping conscious eternal punishment.

Summer 2025 Ministry

This past summer we hosted over 1550 campers. Each one of those campers received the word of God and were presented with the gospel through a physical bible, chapel, cabin discussions, and significant spiritual conversations with camp volunteers. Although it is impossible to summarize all the impacts of what happened this summer a major highlight is that 786 campers got to hear about Jesus who do not attend a church, youth group or other ministry and that 1054 campers engaged in a 1on1 spiritual conversation with a leader. There are also 4 prayer groups being run by summer team members at their high school. As we look to another summer and invite you to join us in sharing the gospel in 2026, we also look back and remember how the Lord has been faithful, present, and worked in the lives of many children and youth this past summer.

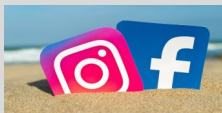
