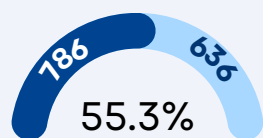
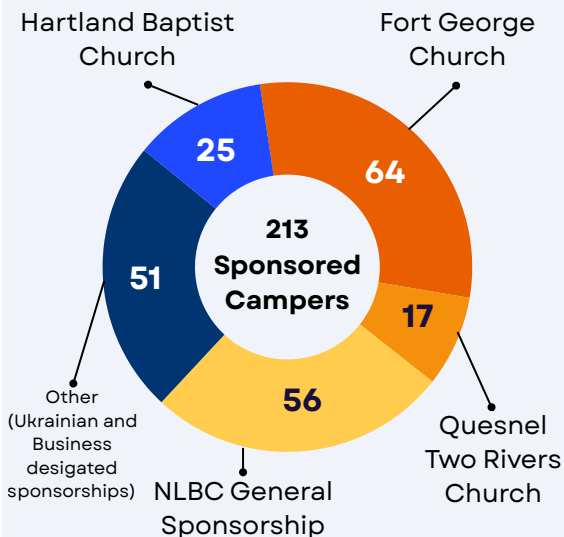


One Hope Canada Purpose

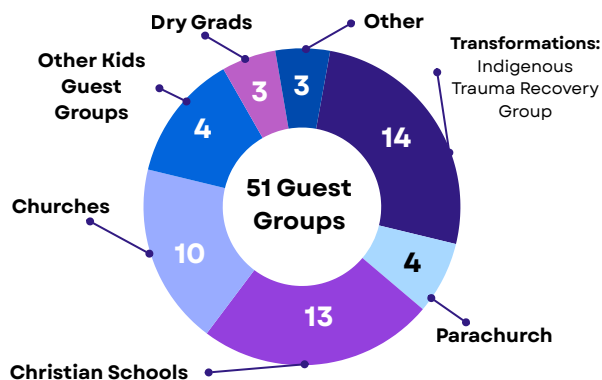

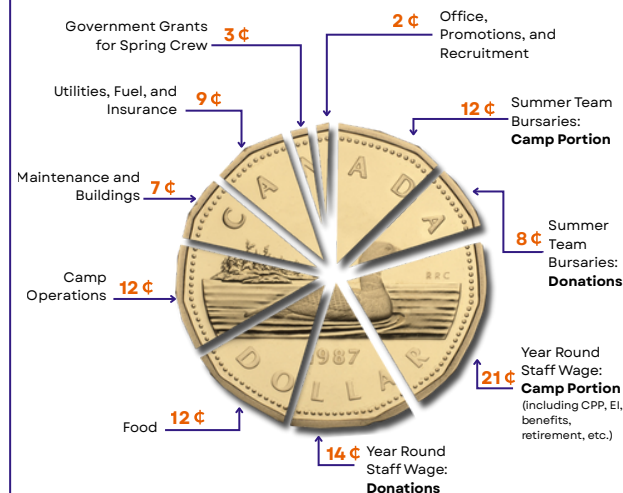

The 2024/2025 budget ran a 2.3% deficit, with food costs, GiantNess, and unexpected building maintenance costs. The budget has been balanced with investment income and reserves. The hope for the 2025/2026 budget is increase income to have a 3% surplus that can build reserves to address maintenance and program needs.
